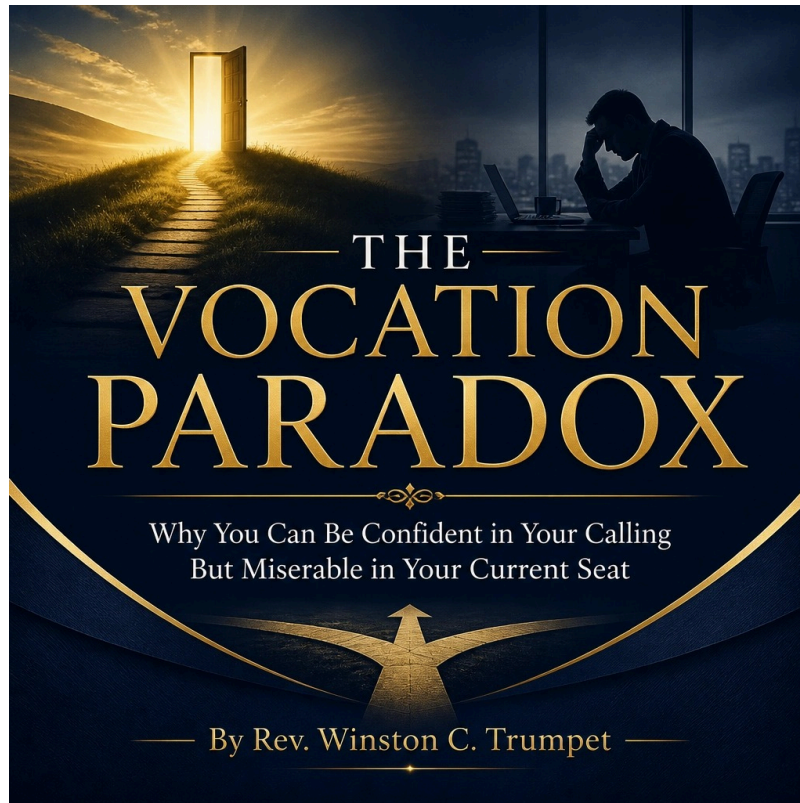


The Vocation Paradox: Why You Can Be Confident in Your Calling But Miserable in Your Current Seat (eBook)

Chapter 1: The Confidence Gap

Why Certainty Doesn't Always Equal Comfort



The Confidence Gap occurs when our **Primary Calling** (to follow Christ and love our neighbor) and our **Secondary Calling** (the specific work we do) are in alignment, but the **Vehicle** we are using to get there is broken.

You might be a gifted teacher (your calling) who is drowning in the administrative bureaucracy of a specific school (your seat). You might be a compassionate shepherd (your calling) trapped in a role that requires you to act like a corporate executive (your seat).

When your seat doesn't support your calling, "mental clutter" sets in. You begin to question your faith, your competence, and even God's voice. But remember: **Suffering in a role is not automatically evidence that you misheard God.**

1. **The Core Calling:** If I had no job title, how would I describe the way I help people? (e.g., "I bring order to chaos," "I comfort the broken," "I challenge the status quo.")
2. **The Daily Drain:** List three tasks that consistently leave you feeling spiritually and emotionally depleted.
3. **The Misery Metric:** On a scale of 1-10, how much of your misery comes from *the work itself* versus *the environment or way the work is done*?

Chapter 2: The Wiring Mismatch

Understanding Your Divine Design
